The Social Justice Committee this past month continued to organize our church's weekly donations to the Ministry in the Park. Several parishioners have also provided meals to the Grants Pass shelter and there are still opportunities to join the "Meal Train". (See Concetta for the link.) You might want to combine your efforts so that the cost of the meal does not fall to one family. Thank you to all who continue to donate.

We have effectively responded to Bishop Diana's request that all churches develop a Land Acknowledgment that is shared at each service. We do not wish this to become simply performative and so we invite you to participate in educational activities that will inform us about the culture and history of the people who were the original caretakers of this land. We will be hosting a Book group one Sunday a month. The first book we will be reading is "Braiding Sweet Grass" by Robin Wall Kimmerer. Nik Grimsby has been able to secure 10 library copies for our use so please see Nik. A list of additional books is available on our website and Facebook Page and will be posted on the Church Bulletin Board. We also hope to invite a speaker representing one of the local tribes to address the church at some point in the months to come.
