

Resolution

Dear St. Luke's:



We sent out the Resolution to each member of the congregation per instructions from the Trust document and waited the required two weeks before taking the vote. At the meeting on the 5th of March there were 25 members of the congregation present. The Trust document states that only those present could vote. There is no provision for proxy voting. There was a period of questions, answers, and comments on the Resolution. The Trust also stated that the Resolution had to be approved by three-quarters percent of those present.

The results of the vote were 24 for the Resolution and 1 against. Thank you to all those in attendance.

After the vote, I explained that at our last Vestry meeting we decided to appoint a committee to research the possible uses of our basement to come up with ideas of renovating and renting it for income to help support and sustain the church. The Vestry will ask members of the congregation, the Diocese and outside advisers to help with this process. We plan to set up the committee at our Vestry meeting this month.

Thanks to everyone for their support in the past and going forward. With trust and faith in God, we will make it through this time of trial and testing.


