While trying to fulfill all the requirements to go into assisted living it was found that Peace needed a doctor. He went to the Siskiyou walk-in clinic and it was determined that he had a heart murmur that required an echocardiogram. The echocardiogram showed a narrowed aortic valve, and Peace panicked when he was advised to check into the hospital. He went back to Motel 6 for the night.

After we discussed talking to the cardiologist to learn about his condition and options, I took him to Asante Rogue Regional in Medford. I was with him while the cardiologist explained what was going to happen in the next few days during his hospital stay. Peace then tested positive for COVID, and those plans had to be post-poned for two weeks. His doctor called and doesn't think he is able to give informed consent for any procedure, so he has been referred to a social worker to help him for now.
