Concerns have been raised that it is quite easy for the weekly reading of the Land Acknowledgement to become simply performative. In response to this feedback, the Social Justice Committee invites you to join them in reading "Native" (Identity, Belonging and Rediscovering God) by Kaitlin Curtis. The book group will meet weekly on Wednesdays at 1:30. You are invited to bring your lunch.

We are also considering how our church can raise funds to donate to a scholarship fund for Indigenous youth attending SOU. We would appreciate your thoughts and suggestions. A bake sale and craft sale are being discussed.

The committee will also be showing a short video "The Lunch Date" on October 29th at 11:00 in the parish hall after the service. We hope you will join us during the coffee hour for the video and discussion of how we are all impacted by racism. Reverend Ernestein has a booklist that will be available in the parish hall on racial justice.

The Point in Time Count is scheduled for January. This has been a great community service activity for our church community in the past. Everyone has been able to get involved in a variety of ways. We will again focus on keeping our neighbors warm and will provide hot cocoa and sandwich bags as well as hats, gloves, and scarves. It has also been suggested that we collect warm coats that can be distributed that day.
