Social Justice Committee Report

There seems to be ongoing discussion in the diocese regarding the performative nature of a weekly reading of the Land Acknowledgement. In response to this feedback, the Social Justice Committee invites you to join them at any time in reading "Native" (Identity, Belonging and Rediscovering God) by Kaitlin Curtis. The book seems especially relevant as the diocese has joined other dioceses throughout the country in adopting the **Resolution to Repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery.** The book group meets weekly on Wednesdays at 1:30. You are invited to bring your lunch and join our lively discussion.

We are also considering how our church can raise funds to donate to a scholarship fund for Indigenous youth attending SOU. We are still exploring the options available to Indigenous youth at SOU and will keep you posted.

We want to remind you that November is Indigenous Peoples Heritage Month. All are invited to join the Absolom Jones Episcopal Center for Racial Healing as they celebrate Indigenous Peoples Heritage Month with a discussion by The Reverend Isaiah "Shaneequa" Brokenleg. The topic is "The Complexity of Indian Country" and you can participate by Zoom on November 14th, 2023 at 4 PM. See Concetta for more registration information.

The committee showed a short video "The Lunch Date" on October 29th at 11:00 and discussion followed during coffee hour. A book list compiled by Reverend Ernestein on racial justice is available. (Reverend Ernestein will be periodically updating the list.) Please let Concetta know if you cannot locate a copy.

The Point in Time Count is scheduled for January 24th. **The Point in Time** is sponsored by the Federal Government and takes place throughout the country. A count of the unhoused in our community (that takes place on that day) will impact funding and resources for the coming year. This has been a great service activity for our church community in the past. Everyone has been able to get involved in a variety of ways.

We will again focus on keeping our neighbors warm and will provide hot cocoa and sandwich bags as well as hats, gloves, scarves, socks, jackets and coats. Everyone will be invited to join us on the $23^{\rm rd}$ to make up sandwich bags to be distributed on the following day. (Each volunteer will be asked to bring enough supplies to make up 12 bags each.) We will also be needing other donations of hot chocolate packets, hot cups, and napkins. More information to follow in early January.
