Social Justice Committee Report

The Committee did not meet in November so that members could attend organization meetings for the Homeless Task Force and PATH (Partners Assisting the Homeless). We have learned, as many of you already know, that plans for a warming shelter are moving forward. It is possible that more than one community agency/group may be involved. It now seems that the greatest need will be for volunteers, and we will keep the parish updated as we learn more. Concetta has information on other agencies that serve the unhoused and need volunteers, so please see her if you have any questions.

Members of the committee are meeting with members of PATH as well to discuss the city's program that allows individuals and/or families to sleep overnight in their vehicles in our parking lot. We have the availability of the portable toilet, but a water station is required. This water station would require an additional expenditure of \$105.00 a month. Hana is working on a grant (EBOF) with the diocese to possibly cover the cost of this as well as the toilet.

The Point in Time Count is scheduled for January 24th. **The Point in Time** is sponsored by the Federal Government and takes place throughout the country. A count of the unhoused in our community (that takes place on that day) will impact funding and resources for the coming year. This has been a great service activity for our church community in the past. Everyone has been able to get involved in a variety of ways.

We will again focus on keeping our neighbors warm and will provide hot cocoa and sandwich bags as well as hats, gloves, scarves, socks, jackets, and coats. Everyone will be invited to join us on the 23rd to make up sandwich bags to be distributed on the following day. (Each volunteer on the 23rd will be asked to bring enough supplies to make up 12 bags each.) We will also be needing other donations of hot chocolate packets, hot cups, and napkins. More information to follow in early January.

We will be collecting canned and dry goods for the GREEN BAG project. We ask you to place your donations in the box previously used by FISH. These donations will be collected by the Josephine County Food Bank and then distributed to the various food pantries in the community.
